The tournament was held at the McArthur Island Sports Complex.

Some 55 games took place on the island's four best fields over six days of competition.

Twelve of the country's top girls teams and ten of the nation's best boys teams took part in the championships.

Emerging as champions in the girls division was Brampton Brams United Bandits of Ontario. They defeated Calgary South West United Premiers by a score of 3-0 in the girls' final.

were the victors in the boys division, edging Vaughan Azzurri of | the best they had seen." Ontario 1-0 on an overtime goal scored by Liam McIlvenna.

Both the boys and girls finals were played in front of large crowds, who appreciated the high caliber of play in both matches.

It was the first time in the KYSA's history that the Association has played host to a national youth club championship.

Canada's Tournament Capital

From the desk of Executive Director, Keith Liddiard...



The dates and locations of the 2014
Youth Provincial
Cup tournaments have been set by BC Soccer. The *Premier Cup*, which is being opened up this coming year to any team that wishes to compete at

this level (rather than just BCSPL teams, which has been the case for the last two years), will be hosted by Coquitlam Metro Ford at Town Centre Park in Coquitlam. The Premier Cup services boys and girls from the under-13 age group up to the under-18 division. The champions at this level in under-14, under-16 and under-18 qualify for the National Club Championships. The *Provincial A Cup*, which is open to teams in the boys under-13, under-14, under-15, under-16 and under-18 age groups and girls in the under-13 through under-18 divisions, will be hosted by the Burnaby Youth Soccer Association at the Burnaby Lake Soccer Complex. The 2014 Girls *Provincial B Cup*, which services girls teams from the under-13 age group to the under-18 division, is being hosted by Chilliwack FC at Townsend Park, while the Les Sinnott Memorial Boys Provincial (B) Cup is being staged by the Richmond Soccer Association at Minoru and Hugh Boyd Parks. The Les Sinnott Memorial Boys Provincial (B) Cup is open to teams in the under-13 up to under-18 age groups.

The KYSA extends its congratulations to both the men's and the women's soccer teams at TRU on a very successful 2013 season. The men's team captured the Silver Medal at the CCAA Nationals in St. John, New Brunswick in mid-October, while the women's team won the Bronze medal at their tournament in Surrey. The men's team contains eight players and three coaches who are "products" of the KYSA. The women's team boasts twelve roster play-

ers and four "red shirts" who are "graduates" of the youth association. Two of the women's team coaches also have connections with the KYSA.

The 2014 BC Summer Games is being held in Nanaimo from July 17-20. The soccer component is open to players born in 2002 and 2003 only (U12). In the past the TOYSL organizing committee has looked after fielding teams for this zone and they are doings so once again for the 2014 competition. The Committee is now receiving applications for prospective coaches for both a boys and a girls entry. If you are interested in submitting an application, please contact me at kysaed@telus.net and I will be pleased to forward an application form. This is a voluntary (non-salaried) position. Applicants must have a Community-Coach Senior (CCS) qualification or equivalent. The application deadline is January 30, 2014.

There will be three new faces on the board of KYSA following the election of officers at the KYSA AGM, November 28th. The newly elected directors are: Art McDonald, a Rep team coach in the KYSA, Chris Wilkinson, the father of two mini-soccer aged players, and **Ryan Susheski**, who is also the father of two KYSA players. Ryan is also an active member of the Kamloops Soccer Referees Association. These individuals are replacing: John Moon, who served on the board for the past two years as the chair of the Rep Program Committee, Laura Leadbetter-Fuoco, who served for the past two years and acted as the supervisor of the Youth-Girls (U11-U18) Division, and Chris Butcher, who resigned from the board halfway through a two-year term. Current KYSA President Graham Cope was also re-elected to the board for another two-year term. For the full board of directors for the 2013-2014 season see the photo gallery opposite.






Leah Flor on her first year of refereeing:

"This year I decided to join my husband and become a district soccer referee, with hopes of help-



ing to encourage our youth's love for the game. 2013 was full of diverse and eclectic experiences. Right away, as a new referee, KSRA offered guidance, grass roots training, support and promotion at the local level. As I look back,

My name is Nathan Smith and I have been a KSRA member since I was twelve years old. I



have been officiating at a high level for about three years, which includes many assignments around the province. This year I have been chosen to be a provincial referee candidate. This is big for Kamloops because we haven't had

one in so long. The KSRA has done so much for me over the years. All I had to do was ask and so many people would come to my aid. They are the sole reason that I am where I am today in refereeing.
