early July. We had 7 teams participating in this event; four teams as hosts and three winning the TOYSL playdowns to take a higher seed in the championships. Of those 7 teams our U16 and U18 girls took home the Silver, with our U14 and U15 girls winning Bronze. The KYSA also had strong performances (though no medals) at the Les Sinnott Boys Provincial B Cup Championships in Burnaby. Kamloops was represented by both U13 teams, one of our U15 teams, and the U18 team. Congratulations to all 11 teams who represented our club with pride and honour in these significant year-end events.

The KYSA also saw seven of our athletes chosen to play soccer for the Thompson-Okanagan Zone at the recent BC Summer Games. Amar Brown, Eric Swaine and Hayden Koppes won a Gold medal in an outstanding performance by the boys team. **Hayden** scored a tournament leading 8 goals, including the clincher in the final game. Maiya Zimmerman, Emma Mercuri, Anika Black and Kate Rattee represented Kamloops on the girls team, which I had the privilege of coaching along with fellow Kamloops coaches Sarin Warman and Nevada Woods. We lost the Bronze medal in penalty kicks, but are extremely proud of how the team performed throughout the event. It was exciting to see several other KYSA athletes participating in the Games in other sports. Liam Grover represented Kamloops well in canoeing, Jayse Matanovich and Kalie Saari had good showings in basketball, and Rachel Dixon did the same in towed motorsports. ### SOCCER CHALLENGES WITH YOUR CHILD:

Seeking ideas to grow your child's ability in the game? Consider these three challenges:

Breakaway Challenge: An attacker dribbles towards goal and tries to score on the GK. Rebounds are allowed. Parent and child can alternate roles. Play best of 21 or 99! Use two trees for goal posts or a pair of shoes. Adjust appropriately for your child's age and skill level. Corner Kick Challenge: Players attempt to score a goal on a single shot, but they must start with the ball on the goal line (like a corner kick). Start closer, and a few yards off of the goal line for younger players. Advanced players can be further away and even behind the goal line for a greater challenge. Can you score without the ball touching the ground before it goes in the goal?

Crossbar Challenge: Players attempt to hit the crossbar by kicking, flicking or drop-kicking the ball from the 6, 12 or 18 yard or half-way lines (based on age). Younger players can attempt to pass the ball and hit the goal post (not


