Change To Online Registration Planned for 2019!

There will be a new online registration program in place when team officials and players sign up for the 2019 season!

The new software will simplify the registration process and provide some significant benefits to members in the future.

Due to the implementation of the new software, the opening date for registration has been delayed. While registration typically opens in early November, the opening date this year is expected to be November 27th.

Members are asked for their understanding as the association undergoes this major change. You will be contacted as soon as the system is up and running.




